



Seeking Breast Cancer Survivors

Mind Matters Research is seeking breast cancer survivors to participate in a clinical trial to determine if imagery can improve overall quality of life after cancer treatment.

According to the American Cancer Society, breast cancer is the most common cancer among women. Men are at lower risk, but still make up one percent of the breast cancer population. Anyone previously diagnosed with breast cancer is invited to participate in this study.

Participants must have completed major cancer treatments (surgery, chemotherapy, radiation or a combination of treatments) for at least six weeks. Study participants will take part in classes, written assessments, biofeedback and neurofeedback. Participants must be willing to practice what they learn in class and to keep records of their practice experiences during and after completion of class attendance.
